Task: How does the writer use language to develop a sense of unease in the opening of the text?

The writer exaggerates the harsh weather conditions in the opening of the text stating "The road's a torrent." This makes us think of the road as a fast-paced river. This gives the impression that the house is difficult to access and is cut-off from civilisation. Mr White adds to this with his comment of the house being in the most "beastly, out-of-the-way places" This produces a sense of unease because of the use of the noun 'torrent' which creates an image of a raging river. The weather is used to create a sense of tension and a gothic setting, full of mystery and terror. The danger it creates makes it seem uneasy.
