ADJUSTMENTS TO YEAR 7 BREAKTIME ARRANGEMENTS

We have trialled, this week, an adjustment to Year 7 breaktime whereby the Year group have had their break an hour earlier than the rest of the school. The trial came as a response to Year 7 student voice, supporting our youngest students access the canteen offering more easily. Following the monitoring of this over these past four days, we have made the decision that we shall continue the arrangements after Easter.

We are getting close to the first, full year group, Year 7 Residential. This is occurring shortly after the Easter holidays on Monday 22nd – Wednesday 24th April. YEAR 11 - INFORMATION

The Easter holidays are the final holiday period before the external examinations start. It is vital for Parents/Carers to ensure that your child is engaging in purposeful revision activity over this period.

A reminder that the Student Portal, accessed via your child's Microsoft 365 login, has the Subject Hubs for a number of areas which include specific revision materials and guides. There is also a page devoted to revision techniques. We have also GCSE Pod for all Year 11 students which provides subject specific revision support for the suite of GCSE subjects.

The group of Year 8 students that visited the Leeds Playhouse to view their acclaimed performance of Macbeth were a credit to the school. 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Stage 4 visit! The feedback that we have had from students has been excellent, really showing how a visit to the theatre can enhance the curriculum work done in school.

Create SEND Art Project

Over the past fortnight, groups of students have participated in the Create Art and Design Project. The students all enjoyed the opportunity and created some fantastic pieces of art. We were pleased to be able to welcome Parents and Carers in to the final showcase event. The



feedback from Parents, Students and the visitors who worked with the students was extremely positive. It was clear the impact the project had on the students.

Your child attending school every day is extremely important and is arguably the single most important factor in a child's educational achievement. Below is a summary of what your child's percentage attendance means in terms of learning and success, but also next steps and interventions. Remember, that you can check and track your child's attendance on Arbor.
