


Drug use – Sharing of dirty needles (HIV can live in a used needle for up to 42 days in the

right conditions)

Mother to baby – Through birth and breast feeding (especially if the mother is not on any antiviral medication or unaware of the condition)





Anal sex - Without a condom

BRIEF HISTORY OF HIV & AIDS

The chimpanzee virus mutated into the HIV virus. First known case was a man in 1959 in Democratic Republic of the Congo



Originally believed to have developed from a chimpanzee virus in West Africa. Spread to humans through those that hunted them.

1982 - The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) use the term "AIDS" (acquired immune deficiency syndrome) to describe the illness.

The first cases of AIDS are reported in Europe and Africa.

1981 - First cases of AIDS are identified in the USA. Originally called GRIDS (Gay Related Immune Deficiency) it was thought only homosexual men could get it.



1985 - The U.S. Food and Drug Administration (FDA) approves the

first commercial blood test for HIV.

1984 - The U.S. Department of Health and Human Services announces that AIDS cannot be spread through casual contact, such as touching or sharing food.

1988 - The First 'World AIDS Day' takes place.



1996 Onwards: New treatments (ART Therapy) become available to help extend the lives of those living with HIV and prevent the HIV turning into full blown AIDS



2019 - The global number of people living with HIV reaches 38 million, according to the World Health Organization (WHO). The United Nations announces it's goal of ending the HIV epidemic (reducing new infections by 90%) by 2030.

REDUCING EXPOSURE TO BODILY FLUIDS

Ensuring any health care workers or anyone else who may come into contact with bodily fluids use barrier methods to prevent the spread of infection

EDUCATION ON HIV AND AIDS

Be educated about the risks of HIV and be fully aware of how to protect against it. Celebrate World Aids Day

Pre-exposure Prophylaxis (PrEP)

A drug that can be taken by those who think they may be at high risk of catching HIV

ENCOURAGE MORE NEEDLE EXCHANGE PROGRAMS

Reduce the likelihood of drug users sharing needles

HIV Prevention

PRACTICE SAFE SEX WITH CONDOMS

HIV is commonly spread through unprotected sex

Did you know?

HIV is present in a number of different bodily fluids. However, only six have enough of the virus in them to actually transmit the virus: blood, semen (cum), preseminal fluid (pre-cum), rectal fluids, vaginal fluids, and breast milk.

Taking extra steps during pregnancy

In order to prevent the virus being passed from mother to child e.g. every pregnant woman having an HIV test, antiviral medication taken by mothers, caesarean sections and bottle feeding for HIV positive mothers

Post-exposure Prophylaxis (PEP)

Emergency treatment of drugs that is taken within 72 hours of exposure to HIV


