


Ureteral Opening

Outer Labia (Outer lips of the vagina)

Anus

Clitoris (Glans, shaft & Crura)

This is located at the top of the vulva, where the inner lips meet and has a hood and wings and has thousands of nerve endings.

These are folds of skin around the vaginal opening. Can be short or long, wrinkled or smooth.








Cervical Screening

HPV (Human Papilloma Virus)

- All girls ages 12-13 are offered the HPV vaccine (delivered through schools and consists of 3 injections over 12 months)
- Provides effective protection against cervical cancer for at least 20 years.



Cervical Screening

- Aged 20 25 your doctor will send you a letter about cervical screening
- It is a test to check the health of the cells of your cervix (Entrance to the womb in the vagina)
- Most will show cells are fine but 1 in 20 may show some abnormal changes in the cells
- In most cases this will not mean cancer but in some cases these abnormal cells may need to be removed in order to not develop into cancerous cells.
- You need to be aware but you don't need to worry!

Cervical screening is also known as a Pap test or Pap smear.



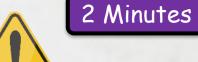
