Art & Design



Everyone is welcome at Chess Club. Whether you are an experienced player or a total novice, the benefits of playing chess will not only develop your social skills, but also your memory and great learning habits.

Skilled chess players learn to anticipate an opponent's next moves. To predict what another person will do next, a player must develop the ability to adopt another person's perspective and infer what action they are likely to take.

Chess games are known for long periods of silent contemplation, during which players consider each move. Players spend time anticipating their opponents' responses and attempting to predict every eventuality.

That habit of mind — careful contemplation and planning — is one of the cognitive health benefits of playing chess.


Axiom Maths



Axiom Maths Circles is an invite-only weekly enrichment programme that trains students to grapple with mathematics from beyond the school curriculum. The idea is to do challenging but satisfying mathematics and enjoy the buzz of solving difficult problems with friends.

Circles are small, nurturing groups – much smaller than normal classes. They meet for an hour a week, with a teacher, to explore problems from the Axiom Maths curriculum.

Axiom Maths is a registered charity that helps to support students in achieving success through small group tasks. It helps to develop their knowledge of significant topics in mathematics and are lead by a mathematics teacher from Crawshaw. We are delighted to be able to offer this group again after a successful launch last year. It will be open to selected Y7 and Y8 students.

STEM club for Year 7 and 8 provides an opportunity for students to explore scientific interests in a supportive practical-led environment. All activities are led by experienced members of our science department.

The Academy currently offers instrumental lessons on a range of different instruments including Woodwind (flute, clarinet, saxophone), Drum Kit, Guitar (acoustic, electric, bass), Keyboard (or piano) and Voice.

All lessons are delivered by highly experienced, professional instrumental tutors. You will receive weekly lessons in pairs or small groups with other students of a similar ability. The majority of students work towards a graded music exam (ABRSM, Rock School, Trinity etc.) These exams are highly valuable and well-respected music qualifications and higher grades lead to UCAS points which can be used when applying to university.





Each year we put on a show that involves a wide number of students from all year groups.

Crawshaw's Got Talent is one of our first performance events of the year and is open to all students to audition individually or in a group.



CRAWSHAW LIFE Careers

Students get the opportunity to encounter employers, employees, workplaces, further and higher education through the variety of trips and in school visits.

We attend the Leeds Creative skills, SEND Next Choices and Apprenticeship careers fairs. To support our KS4 students in making their choices for after Crawshaw, we engage with the Post 16 providers. Trips throughout the year will visit the local Universities, businesses and workplaces, giving Crawshaw students new experiences and inspiring them for their future careers!



MEDIA

The Media team organises a yearly visit to Huddersfield University so that Year 10 students can experience media in the real world.

They have the opportunity to create a mini film in the new film studio, practise their autocue, camera and direction skills in the television studio and participate in a seminar on Film. Students also have the opportunity to have a tour of the campus – a first taste of university for many – and listen to a media careers talk given by one of the lecturers.






Design - STEM


GEOGRAPHY

London Design Trip in December




Year 11 Design and Art students have the opportunity to travel to London for the day. They visit a gallery in addition to experiencing the main London landmarks.

A Ski holiday gives students the opportunity to visit a beautiful part of the world and take part in an activity that few people previously experience. 4 Days in Berlin – History focus



FEBRUARY 2027

This visit is open to students studying History at GCSE and includes the following excursions.

- A guided tour to Sachsenhausen Concentration camp.
- A tour of the East German Stasi Prison.
- An evening tour of the Reichstag Dome, with views across Berlin.
- A visit to the House of the Wannsee Conference (the location of Final Solution conference and decision).
- Visits to historically significant locations such as: the Topography of Terror, the
 Brandburg Gate, the Memorial to the Murdered Jews of Europe, the Berlin Wall and
 the East Side Gallery, the Olympic Stadium and Checkpoint Charlie (amongst many
 other sites).
- Visits to locations of cultural interest, including: food markets, Rausch chocolatier, Alexanderplatz and shopping opportunities.

5 days in Sorrento – Geography focus



OCTOBER 2025 and OCTOBER 2026

This visit is open to all studeNts studying Geography at GCSE and includes the following excursions.

- A hike to the summit of Mount Vesuvius.
- A guided tour of the Roman Settlement of Pompeii, which was devastated by a volcanic eruption in 79 AD.
- A short ferry ride to the idyllic Isle of Capri. This excursion includes an optional Laser Boat Tour around the island where students will see the spectacular coastal views of Capri.
- A tour of a typical Southern Italian, family-run 'Fondo Galatea' working farm that
 produces some of the finest food in the region including cheese, meat, jam and olive
 oil. The tour concludes with a pizza making session where students get to taste their
 own creations.
- A visit to town of Sorrento for Italian gelato and souvenir shopping.
- An ice cream making demo and tasting session in Sorrento.
- A visit to the volcanic landscapes of Solfatara which is part of the Phlegraean Fields super volcano.

4 days in Paris – MFL Focus



July 2024 & June 2026

The Paris trip gives students the opportunity to experience Parisian culture up close and practise their language skills in a variety of different settings. Students get to see a range of the key sights in Paris, taste local delicacies and get to know other students in a new environment.

This trip is open to everyone doing GCSE French in Year 10 and anyone in Year 9 studying French.
