Task: How does the writer use language to show Subhi's feelings towards Eli?

The use of **repetition** throughout the first chapter of the book shows Subhi's devotion to Eli. The shared experiences in the detention centre give Eli a 'god-like' quality in Subhi's eyes. He worships him. The writer uses a repetition to present the character of Eli, Eli, he reckons I must be going through a growth spurt... Eli's probably right about that growth spurt..." This shows that the character of Subhi looks up to Eli for support and for guidance as his own father isn't there to play this role. He respects him and he looks up to him because Eli's experience mirror's Subhi's family's experience. Eli holds a position of power for Subhi which no one else in the camp does. The writer wanted to show this deep bond at the beginning of the book to highlight the importance of relationships in these detention centres where no other freedoms are allowed.
