# **CULTURE FOR LEARNING EXPECTATIONS – UPDATES AND REMINDERS**

Returning for the new term, we have been focussing on a reminder of our expectations to support a positive and impactful learning environment.

There has been an adjustment to the sanctions process in school, beginning this week. Senior Leadership detention has been reintroduced, which will now run on a Monday afternoon from 3.00 – 5.00 pm. Students who miss a 1 hour after school detention will do an SLT DT on the following Monday. This will be held in the STR7 and 8 computer rooms. Should a student miss a second 1 hour in the same week, they will still do the SLT DT but will also complete a day in ReStart.

We have a current focus on ensuring that standards of uniform are high. Please can Parents / Carers pay particular attention to the issue of leggings and trainers, neither of which are school uniform nor, therefore, acceptable.

If I can take this opportunity to remind you of the rules around mobile phones. Since introducing the **no visible phones on the school site** policy, the climate surrounding mobile phones on school site has improved and this is helping to promote a safe environment, supporting our messaging over the impacts of inappropriate mobile phone / social media use.

It is important that Parents/Carers are reminded that a mobile phone will only be confiscated should a student make the decision not to follow the clear and simple policy. It would then need to be collected by Parents/Carers (between 3.00 and 4.00 pm (2.30 and 3.30pm on a Friday)). Students must have their device switched off and out of sight from the moment they enter the school grounds. If students do this, there is no reason for there to be any concerns over confiscation and the implications related to it.





### YEAR 11 - INFORMATION

**The Year 11 Parents' Evening** was held last night, in person. Thank you to all Parents/Carers who attended. Trial examination grades were given out as part of the evening with children completing a reflection sheet with parents on what receiving those results in August would mean for next steps. It also allowed successes in the Trial examinations to be celebrated and an opportunity to consider on the effectiveness of revision strategies used.

The next key date for Year 11 Parents is the **Parent and Child Revision Evening** which will be held on **Tuesday 6<sup>th</sup> February**. This evening will focus on the lead up to the examination season and include practical revision strategies, modelled by using content from the Core subject areas. This evening has been well received by Parents in the past and we are looking to run two sessions on the night to support attendance. Further details will be shared by Mrs Dyson, Key Stage 4 Phase Leader, in the coming weeks but please put the date in your diary.

There will be a further set of Trial examinations that will run at the end of February / beginning of March. These will be the final opportunity for students to apply their learning in examination conditions and prioritise their plans for the final few weeks before external written examinations beginning in May.

A full overview of the Year 11 external examinations in the Summer were given out at the Parents' Evening, but a copy can also now be found on the school website here: <u>Crawshaw Academy - Red Kite Learning Trust - Exams Information</u>. Once the final exam entries are submitted to the exam boards in February, we will be able to publish individual timetables for students. Their exams will also show on their Arbor calendars in due course.

Finally, a reminder that the Student Portal has a range of revision strategies alongside subject specific hubs which include materials to support revision. For example, the Geography Hub site includes revision booklets that focus specifically on the content and case studies studied at Crawshaw. The student portal can be accessed by students using their Microsoft Office 365 login.

# YEAR 9 INTO 10 OPTIONS EVENING

Parents/Carers of Year 9 students should note that we will be holding our **Year 9 into 10 Option Choices Evening** on **Thursday 25<sup>th</sup> January**. This event will be **in-person**. This is a change from the last couple of years, following the pandemic, where the process was held virtually. A letter outlining the evening will be sent to Parents/Carers next week, but please place this date in your diary. It is very important for at least one Parent/Carer to

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attend along with your Year 9 child to understand the process, hear from subject areas about the qualifications available, and know the next steps and key dates.

## **FIRST AID**

We are taking the start of the new term to clarify with Parents the situation with First Aid in school. First Aid is not open during AM form time or Period 1 unless there is an emergency. This is because you, as a Parent/Carer, have made the decision to send your child to school. It is very rarely the case that a child will begin to feel much worse in the first hour than they were when it was decided they were well enough for school.

Should a child begin to feel unwell during the school day, First Aid can be accessed during break and lunch time.

#### **BATTLE OF THE BANDS**

#### **MESSAGE FROM THE SECRETARY OF STATE FOR EDUCATION**

Gillian Keegan, the Secretary of State for Education, has written to schools to ask us to publicise the following consultations the Department for Education has launched in recent weeks and to invite you to share your views about them. The following is an extract from her message with hyperlinks to the consultations:

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- <u>Introducing minimum service levels in education</u> help us design a policy to protect children and young people's education whilst balancing an individual's right to strike. **This consultation is open until 30 January.**
- <u>Gender questioning guidance</u> share your views on the draft guidance for schools and colleges on how best to support pupils questioning their gender in schools and colleges. **The consultation is open until 12 March.**
- <u>Advanced British Standard</u> we are seeking views on the design and implementation of the landmark qualification framework, as well as how it will be assessed and awarded. **The consultation is open until 20 March.**

We have the formal exam certificates for the previous 10 exam seasons for GCSE and A Level, including last summer's (2023) examination series. Please can you organise these to be collected from **Reception**. They will need to be signed for when collected by the student or, if they cannot attend, a letter from the student will need to be produced indicating who they have authorised to collect them on their behalf.

We do not keep certificates on a permanent basis and will be confidentially disposing of certificates that are not collected. If you or your child have not picked up certificates from during this time, then please can you organise for this to happen in the coming weeks.
