2) END OF YEAR ACADEMIC YEAR ARRANGEMENTS Friday 19th July

3) INFORMATION AND ACTIONS OVER THE SUMMER HOLIDAYS Contact with school over the Summer holiday

School will be open however reception will not be staffed. Please do not visit in person during this time without a prearranged appointment. Emails and voicemails will be monitored periodically throughout the holidays and responded to when needed and where it is possible to do so given staff holidays.

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Year 11 Results Day – Thursday 22nd August

Results Day is on Thursday 22nd August. Year 11 Parents/Carers have received an MS Form that asks for confirmation that your child is coming in to school to collect their results and, if not, what option they are choosing to receive their results. Thank you in advance for helping us plan for the morning.

Passes for Reasonable adjustments including Toilet passes – Applications for 2024-2025

We are increasingly finding that some students with, for example, toilet passes are using them frequently, and therefore missing out on valuable learning time. For our teachers, this has implications for disrupting their lessons, for when students leave and return.

While we don't close all the toilets during lessons, we do ask staff to minimise the number of students out of lessons, specifically straight after, or just before a breaktime. Students are reminded regularly to use the toilets before/after school and during breaks and lunchtimes.

While accessing the toilet may seem like such a simple request, in a school with over 1100 students, there are practical and logistical implications to supervising facilities, and ensuring that children are safeguarded when outside of their scheduled lessons.

Toilet passes are for the small minority of students who have a medical condition and require them to have more regular and immediate access. We want to support students who rightly need this type of access but currently have too many who are misusing the system and where the above definition does not fit.

As such, we shall be contacting the Parents/Carers of students who currently have a toilet pass or a pass for other reasonable adjustments to review and confirm the evidence or the need for this prior to next year. Please look out in the coming days for this communication if this applies to your child.

Uniform

Please can you ensure that you use the summer holiday to replace and refresh uniform so that your child returns in September fully compliant with the uniform policy.

A reminder of our rule about piercings, one plain stud per ear with no additional piercings. Facial piercings, therefore, must be removed. If your child is considering a piercing, it is suggested that the summer holidays is the best time to do this so that piercings that do not meet our published uniform expectations can be removed [retainers are not allowed].

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We will again open our **pre loved uniform shop** in the summer. This will be run on a pay as you feel basis. The shop will be open from 11am to 1pm on RESULTS DAY, on Thursday 22nd August, and also in the first week of term in September from 3pm to 4pm.

MOBILE PHONES

This time last year we informed you about the introduction of our updated mobile phone policy. We would like to thank you for your support on this throughout the whole of this

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year. The feedback from parents/carers has been overwhelmingly positive and this has meant that our school has been a site that feels significantly different. Students have risen to meet our expectations. Break times and lunchtimes now see students conversing with each other, rather than huddled over a screen. We have been able to educate students as to the safeguarding concerns over the misuse of mobile phones, explaining why we do not allow them in school.

Where students have chosen to not follow the rules, we have been pleased with the support of parents who recognise that what we are asking of students is simple and reasonable to follow. It has made a huge difference to the school.
