Everyone is welcome at Chess Club. Whether you are an experienced player or a total novice, the benefits of playing chess will not only develop your sociial skills, but also your memory and great learning habits.

Skilled chess players learn to anticipate an opponent's next moves. To predict what another person will do next, a player must develop the ability to adopt another person's perspective and infer what action they are likely to take.

Chess games are known for long periods of silent contemplation, during which players consider each move.


Players spend time anticipating their opponents' responses and attempting to predict every eventuality.

That habit of mind — careful contemplation and planning — is one of the cognitive health benefits of playing chess.

The Academy currently offers instrumental lessons on a range of different instruments including Woodwind (flute, clarinet, saxophone), Drum Kit, Guitar (acoustic, electric, bass), Keyboard (or piano) and Voice.

All lessons are delivered by highly experienced, professional instrumental tutors. You will receive weekly lessons in pairs or small groups with other students of a similar ability. The majority of students work towards a graded music exam (ABRSM, Rock School, Trinity etc.) These exams are highly valuable and well-respected music qualifications and higher grades lead to UCAS points which can be used when applying to university.





Each year we put on a show that involves a wide number of students from all year groups.






#### Year 7 Halloween Disco



Open to students of all ages, Strategy Club offers a challenging miniature wargaming experience using model figures on scenic battlefields.

The playing field is a tabletop model of a battlefield, which can be developed into realistic terrain, with fantastic scenery, derelict buildings, landmarks and shrubbery.

Other equipment needed, includes a rule book, dice, a tape measure, pen and paper, and the figures, or models, who are really the stars of the show.

Models can be customised by choosing different paint colours and techniques to make the collection more personal and help with identification during battle.

# **MEDIA**

The Media team organises a yearly visit to Huddersfield University so that Year 10 students can experience media in the real world.

They have the opportunity to create a mini film in the new film studio, practise their autocue, camera and direction skills in the television studio and participate in a seminar on Film. Students also have the opportunity to have a tour of the campus — a first taste of university for many — and listen to a media careers talk given by one of the lecturers.







**Design - STEM**

Cost to parents/carers: Approximately £40




## **HISTORY**

Cost to parents/carers: TBC






# CRAWSHAW LIFE HISTORY

Every year Judith Rhodes comes to school to talk to a group of Year 9 students studying the Holocaust. Her 'Little Suitcase' talk, documentary and Q&A session focuses on the early life of Judith's mother Ursula who was a Jewish girl transported to England to escape the Nazis in the late 1930s.

#### **London Design Trip in December**




Year 11 Design and Art students have the opportunity to travel to London for the day. They visit a gallery in addition to experiencing the main London landmarks.

## CRAWSHAW LIFE Ski Trip

#### 7 day Ski Trip to Andorra



This visit is open to students in Y9, Y10 and Y11.

A Ski holiday gives students the opportunity to visit a beautiful part of the world and take part in an activity that few people previously experience. It doesn't matter if you are a complete beginner or an experienced skier. It also doesn't matter if you consider yourself to be a top sportsperson, this trip is for everyone!

The trip involves flights, 6 days skiing, full board accommodation and apres ski activities on an evening, including a shopping evening in the capital city of Andorra La Vella.

#### 4 Days in Berlin – History focus



#### **FEBRUARY 2025**

This visit is open to students studying History at GCSE and includes the following excursions.

- A guided tour to Sachsenhausen Concentration camp.
- A tour of the East German Stasi Prison.
- An evening tour of the Reichstag Dome, with views across Berlin.
- A visit to the House of the Wannsee Conference (the location of Final Solution conference and decision).
- Visits to historically significant locations such as: the Topography of Terror, the Brandburg Gate, the Memorial to the Murdered Jews of Europe, the Berlin Wall and the East Side Gallery, the Olympic Stadium and Checkpoint Charlie (amongst many other sites).
- Visits to locations of cultural interest, including: food markets, Rausch chocolatier, Alexanderplatz and shopping opportunities.

5 days in Sorrento – Geography focus



#### **SEPTEMBER 2024 and SEPTEMBER 2025**

This visit is open to all students studying Geography at GCSE and includes the following excursions.

- A hike to the summit of Mount Vesuvius.
- A guided tour of the Roman Settlement of Pompeii, which was devastated by a volcanic eruption in 79AD.
- A short ferry ride to the idyllic Isle of Capri. This excursion includes an optional Laser Boat Tour around the island where students will see the spectacular coastal views of Capri.
- A tour of a typical Southern Italian, family-run 'Fondo Galatea' working farm that
  produces some of the finest food in the region including cheese, meat, jam and olive
  oil. The tour concludes with a pizza making session where students get to taste their
  own creations.
- A visit to town of Sorrento for Italian gelato and souvenir shopping.
- An ice cream making demo and tasting session in Sorrento.
- A visit to the volcanic landscapes of Solfatara which is part of the Phlegraean Fields super volcano.
