Question	Marks	Timing (Extra time)	Guidance
Reading/annotating text and questions	0	10 minutes	Read the source carefully – what is the genre/atmosphere/mood?
1) List 4 things from the passage	4	5 minutes	 Read the question carefully – which lines are you looking at? You can copy information directly.
2) How does the writer use language for effect?	8	10-15 minutes (15 minutes with extra time)	 Write 2 or 3 WHW paragraphs. Is it positive/negative/mixed? Analyse methods and key words. Look for word patterns and then figurative language
3) How does the writer use structure to interest the reader?	8	10 minutes	 Write 3 paragraphs: P1 - Focus at the start and why? P2 - Shift in focus/zoom in/zoom out – why? P3 - Focus at the end and why? Use ACES to look for focal points – atmosphere, character, event, setting.
4) Respond to a statement about the extract - evaluate the opinion.	20	20-25 minutes (30 minutes with extra time)	Write 3 paragraphs and invest time in this Q. Evaluate the statement (agree/disagree) at the start and end of your paragraph. Use WHW and make sure you analyse HOW the writer creates certain effects.
5) Descriptive or narrative writing (one of which is based on an image)	40	45 minutes (1 hour with extra time)	Invest time here. Plan and write 5 paragraphs. Use a range of sentence structures and a wider range of punctuation. Suggestions: 1. Set the mood – one word sentence. Simile. Zoom in on a feature. Zoom out (in the distance,) 2. Atmosphere building through sensory language (could use a named paragraph) 3. Shift to character – describe eyes, body language, clothing. 4. Time shift – using character or location (what's it like in Winter/Summer?) 5. Change the mood – describe a change in the light, the sounds, the weather, the atmosphere
